President's Message

The Friends of Adams County Library System: Summer Book Sale Bonanza

Dear Friends.

In past years, the Friends have sponsored a variety of fundraising events to provide financial support for the Adams County Library System. Some of these events included plant sales, concerts, book store sales, E-Bay sales in the mid 90's, book sales, presentations by local authors and other speakers, and an annual circus!

During the past two years, our fundraising focus has been on selling books. Many thanks to the generosity of donors who have kept us supplied with a huge volume of gently used books. Our Garage Manager, Team Leaders and Garage Volunteers have been very busy preparing for our 2022 sale events.

The Second Annual Spring Fever Garage Sale, held in April, was successful, earning \$1,264 in sales, bake sale items, donations and memberships. Approximately 20 volunteers participated with a total number of volunteer hours for the day exceeding 80 hours.

The Gettysburg Outdoor Spring Antique Fair, held in May, brought us a total of \$491 in cash donations with approximately 10 volunteer workers donating a combined total of more than 60 hours.

Our largest fundraising activity for many years has been the Summer Book Sale Bonanza. Currently, the teams are preparing for another huge event, with nearly 30,000 books sorted, boxed and ready to set up.

Our dedicated volunteers are the key to making these events profitable, and they deserve a big thank you for donating their valuable time on behalf of the Friends and the Library. **Hope to see you in July!**



Where Do All Those Books at the July Book Sales Come From?

You probably know that the used books sold year-round in the library bookstore and at the one-day sales throughout the year, as well as at the big summer sale the end of July, are all donated by legions of dedicated readers and Friends of the Library. But how do they get from the garage drop-off point into the store and onto the tables at the sales?

Well, there's an interesting history to the process and how it developed over the years. Even in the early days of the library when it was in the municipal building (the old jail) on East High Street, there were occasional book sales in the parking lot. These continued with the move to the present building. Over the years donations have increased, and now hundreds of used books come into the library's garage every week. They must all be examined for condition and then sorted by category. A large number of books are held for the bookstore while the rest are packed up into storage boxes to await the next sale.

Working in the garage is not always the ideal environment - crowded and stuffy in the hot summer weather, and chilly in the winter. But it is always interesting ("Look at this book!") and fun. The volunteers are all of a like mind - even though they are individuals - they all love books.

A couple long-time volunteers (retired from the garage now) recently reminisced about the "early days" in the garage and the annual book sale, and, boy, was it different! Ellie Kuhn recalls "sitting on the library steps, waiting to see if anyone came by with books to donate." She and fellow volunteer Nancy Harmon chuckled, remembering those first early book sales. "All the books (unsorted) were just put out on the tables on the driveway for sale."

Things improved a little after that. Books were sorted into fiction and nonfiction. The original corps of volunteers (Ellie, Nancy, and Dottie Fidler) were joined by Marion Benchoff, and the process became more sophisticated. The space in the garage was very limited because they shared the space with the library van. All books were now sorted by category and as they were sorted, they were placed on the floor on pieces of cardboard with the category written on it - step carefully ladies!

Through it all (and we've come so far in terms of the sorting process) everyone had fun, as we still do. The volunteers can be found in the garage every Tuesday and Thursday morning, always marveling at the wonderful variety of books, at the old books (many well-loved treasures), and the great condition of the vast majority.

Always there's a sense of gratitude to those readers who have so generously donated their books to our library - giving us the opportunity to offer them to others who will benefit from the knowledge, inspiration, and delights they hold.

Volunteers who work in the garage (some regular as clockwork, others as schedules permit) are Garage Coordinator Mike Shoemaker, Friends President Sharon Graff, Ken and Maryann Oelkers, Theresa Roberts, Lin Ackerman, Mail Coordinator Dean Norwich, Catharine Roth, and Joann Prehn.
