Dear Friends,

As your newly elected President, and on behalf of the Board of Directors, I want to thank all of you for your continued support to the Friends of the Library. I enjoyed meeting with many of you at our November Annual Meeting. We had a wonderful presentation from Judie Butterfield on "The Use of Posters as Propaganda." She is a most entertaining speaker, and we learned many things about history that we never knew!

At the annual meeting in November, we were able to present a check for \$55,000 to the Adam's County Library System. That is only made possible because of the tireless efforts of our many dedicated Volunteers. At present, we have individuals who do the sorting of the book donations that come into the back of the library, and a cadre of 33 Volunteers who man the different shifts in our bookstore. It takes nearly 100 Volunteers to have a successful Book Sale, doing such jobs as setting up tables, placing signage, opening boxes and arranging the books on the tables. Once we open, we have Volunteers helping by greeting and directing the crowds, restocking and re-sorting tables, counting the books at checkout, and acting as cashiers. When the sale is over, there are the jobs of repacking boxes, storing unsold books back in the warehouse, and tearing down the signs and tables. Sounds like fun? I can honestly say that it is hard work, but it is enjoyable. I have met so many neighbors and new friends at our events, and so will you if you want to get involved. Other events throughout the year include donation tables at the Farmer's Market, Spring Fever Garage Sale, South Mountain Fair, and the Library's Fun Fest. We were rained out at the Christmas Festival this year, but that won't stop us from planning for 2023. (Fun fact: We logged over 5000 volunteer hours in 2021, may have that even more for 2022!)

It goes without saying that we need our members to get more involved than ever before if we are to continue our success. At present, we have 329 active members, and we would love to have any interested members come to our Board meetings which are held on the second Tuesday of every month at the library. We have several committee positions that could use your help, as well as the open Board position of Vice-President. I would love to talk to anyone interested. One final note, in the past we have put out a Newsletter four times a year. We have decided to send this out only twice a year, in the Winter and the Summer. Again, I look forward to my 2-year term as your Board President and look forward to meeting more of you in the coming year.

As we begin another year at the Friends of the Gettysburg Library Bookstore, I wanted to share some facts about 2022. We sold 2,268 hardback fiction/non-fiction books; 1,972 large paperback fiction/non-fiction books and 1,915 history books. The grand total of books, puzzles, DVDs, CDs and children's books sold was 8,000! We definitely made more money on the history books. The highest sale was around \$350 to one person and that was history books. Our total donation to the Gettysburg Library was \$20,000.


So, to all the volunteers, thank you for showing up and working your shift.
