## Mid-year at the Adams County Library

It's been another busy year at your library system and its hard to believe that the year is almost half over. It began with the retirement of former Executive Director Laura Goss. After several decades of service to the library system, we wished her well in pursuing her passions outside of librarianship. We also began the year with our annual "Winter Reading Challenge."

I joined Adams County Library at the end of March. Just in time for you to celebrate National Library Week and #LibraryGivingDay with us for an entire month in April. Donations rolled in all month long to help us ensure that children throughout the county have access to new children's books. The results are appearing on shelves now and can be found at your closest library.

The "Living Library" was also held in April. This program is a partnership between the Adams County Library and YWCA of Gettysburg. It invites library users to "check-out" one of our volunteers and listen to a story or join a conversation with someone for about thirty minutes. It's a fun and engaging way to get to know more about other people living in your community because there's always 'more to the story!'

Many new resources have been added to the library system already this year. New databases have been added to our website, Comics Plus with comics, manga, and more has been added to our ebook platform, CloudLibrary, and blood pressure monitors are now available for check-out. The monitors can be found in the library's online catalog or a permanent blood pressure monitor station is available on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the Gettysburg Library.

Our One Book title has been announced. This year, we are reading "The Cartographers" by Peng Shepherd. The genre bending title is a suspense thriller with elements of fantasy and magical realism. The reader follows Nell Young as she grapples with the death of her estranged father, her discovery of the mystery shrouding his life and hers, and Nell's attempt to understand how it all ties back to a 1930's highway map. Keep an eye out for related programming later this year and an opportunity to meet the author.

Registration is now open for SummerQuest, the library's reading and learning program for all ages. This year's theme is Adventure Begins at Your Library! All six library branches have special programs and prizes for children and adults. Available with SummerQuest, Get Outdoors Adams is partnering with Wellspan to provide a physical activity program for children, families and adults.

From June 3<sup>rd</sup> until July 13<sup>th</sup>, you can stop by the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the Gettysburg Library to explore "Harry Potter's World: Renaissance Science, Magic and Medicine," an exhibit from the National Library of Medicine. Did you know that the magic from the famous series borrowed heavily from Renaissance history? The exhibit invites visitors to explore the intersection between magic and medicine.

Through the months of transition, growth, and work, the Friends have been present to offer their support. In addition to the financial and volunteer support that Friends of the Library provide, you offer a close, visual representation of the recognized impact that a library can have on its community. Friends of the Library show us that the community cares about their library because you are willing to give of your time and talents to support library work and library workers. For that, I want to extend my most sincere gratitude to our Friends.

One article can't capture everything that has and is happening at your library. I invite you to stop by, visit our website, or check-out "What's Happening" to explore the many activities and resources available to you. We'll see you soon!

This is the perfect moment to stock up on great vacation reads, pursue info on interests new and old, or simply replenish those home bookshelves.


