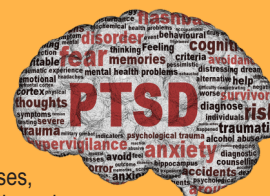


PTSD: The Invisible Wound that Plagues America

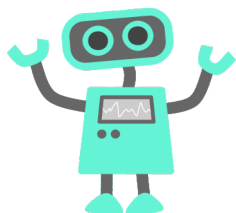
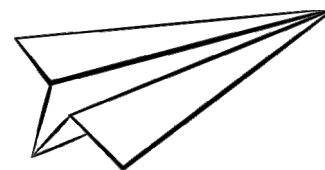
